1-on-1 Discipleship Program

Passage Guide

The following breakdown is the suggested order for the 12 proposed sessions of our 1-on-1 Discipleship Program. Feel free to adjust with your partner as necessary.

What should a typical one-to-one Bible reading meeting look like?

1. Reading – Read the passage together, out loud.
2. Conversation – About the passage and to/about each other.
3. Application – Consider how to make Scripture real in your life.
4. Prayer – Before/after reading. For each other. For specific things.
5. Plan – Set up your next meeting.

What preparation should I do before meeting?

It is good for each of you to read the planned verses in advance of each meeting, just so you begin to think about and meditate on it—but you should also read it together when you meet. If you have specific questions you can look up those answers on your own, using a good study Bible, or other resources. Be mindful that you don't come "with all the answers," but ready to hear from your partner's perspective and how they might sharpen you.

What method should we use for reading and discussing?

Here are three suggestions; you and your partner should feel free to do whatever works best for you both.

1. Provided Questions:

Use the questions under each assigned passage in the Study Questions (available at calvaryrpc.org/discipleship) to guide your discussion. Do not feel limited by them, let your conversation flow. Make sure to pray with your partner as well.

2. Swedish Method:

- a. Read out loud.
- b. Read silently.
- c. Write Down:
 - i. Observations
 - ii. Questions
 - iii. Application
- d. Share.
- e. Pray.

3. C.O.M.A. Method:

- a. Read.
- b. Ask about:
 - i. Context
 - ii. Observation
 - iii. Meaning
 - iv. Application
- c. Pray
